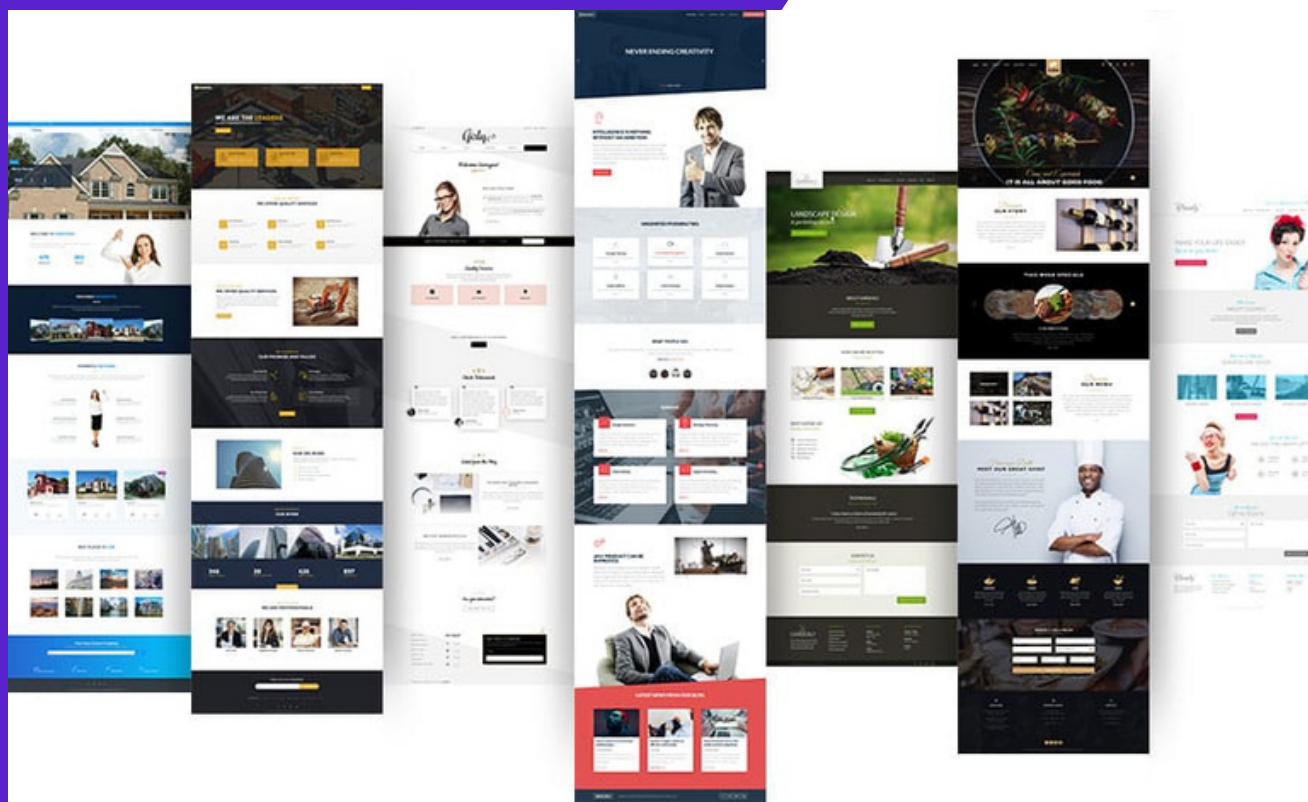

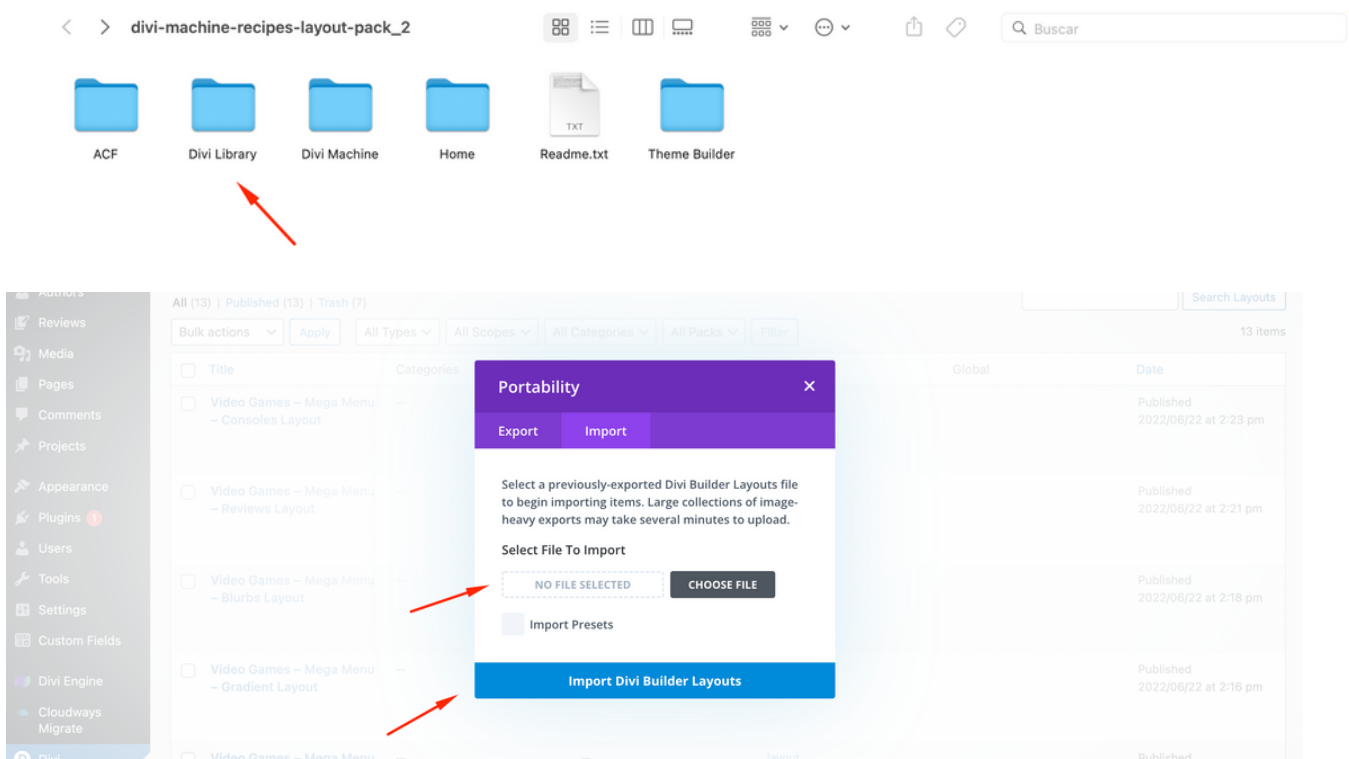

# 1. GENERAL STEPS (ALL PLUGINS)

## Importing the Divi Library Layouts

Import the JSON file located in the Zip File: Divi Library folder > "name of the layout".JSON to Divi > Divi Library.

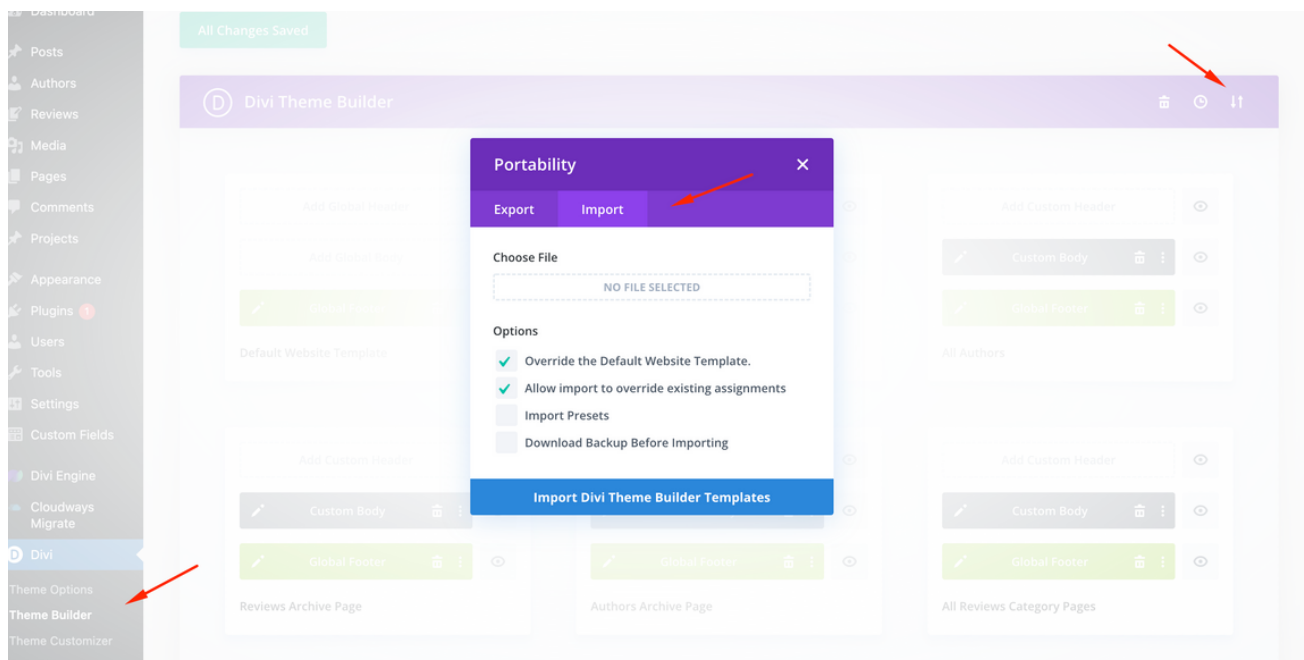
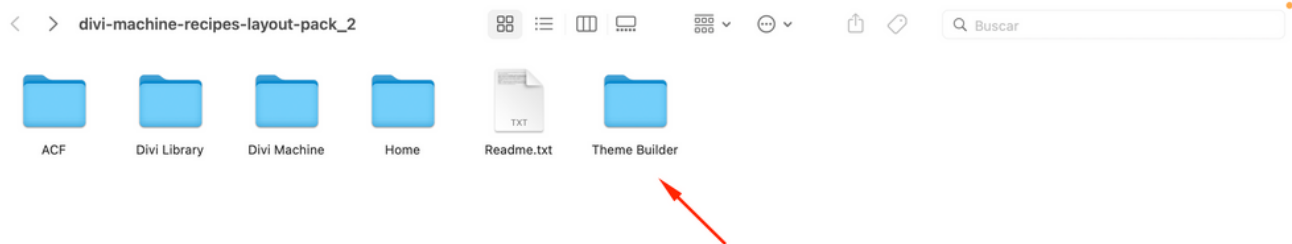


Make sure to check the layout download page to see what Options you need to follow to make sure the layout works correctly.

### Importing the Theme Builder Layouts

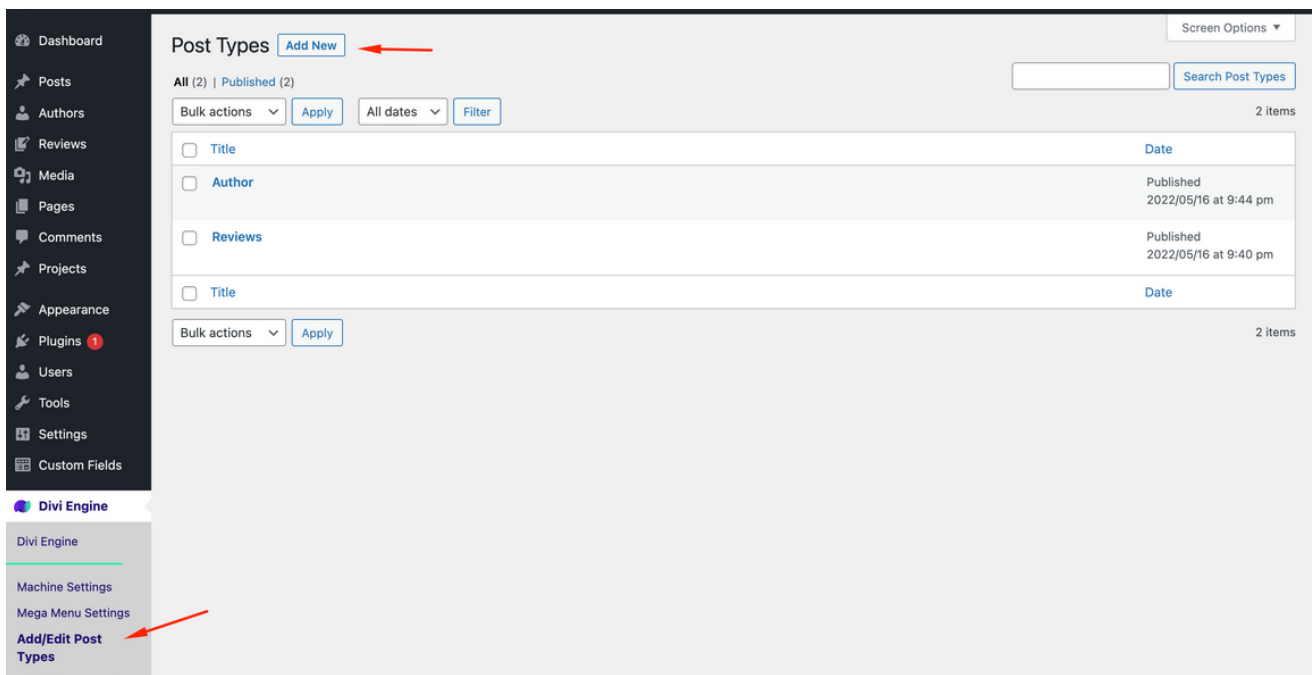
Import the JSON file in the zip file Theme Builder > "name of the layout".JSON to Divi > Theme Builder



## 2. DIVI MACHINE

### Step 1: Creating Required Custom Post Types

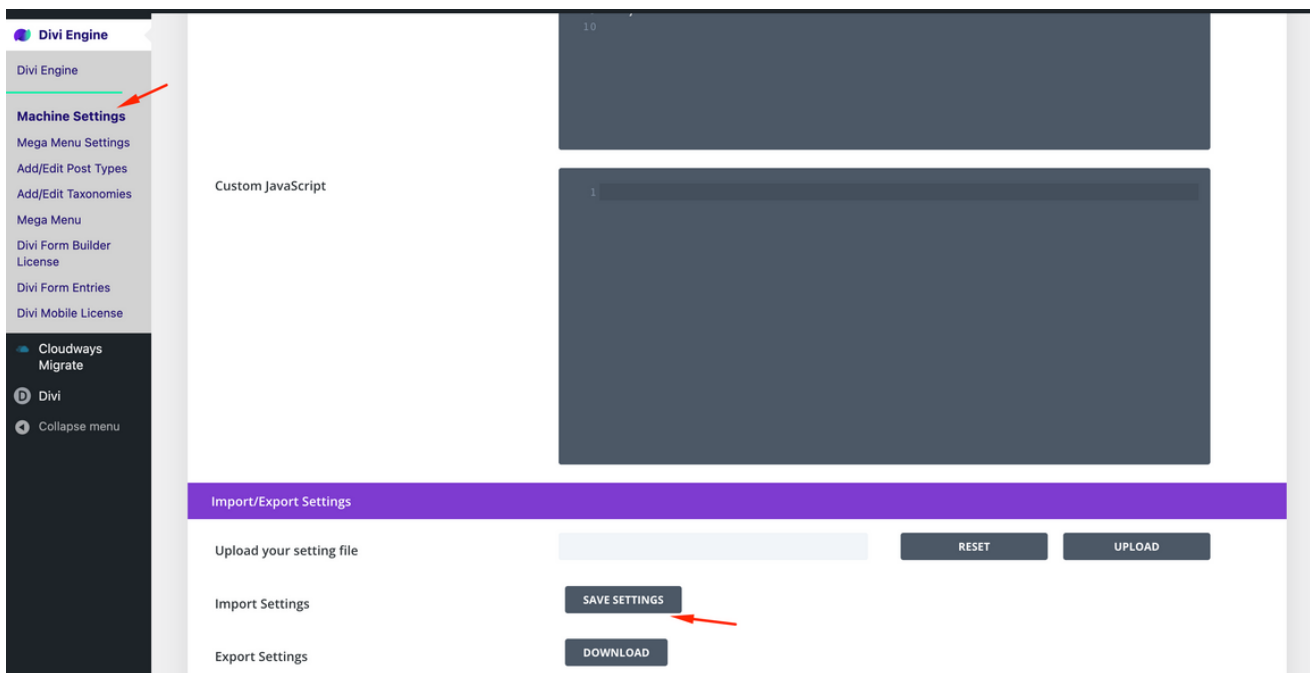
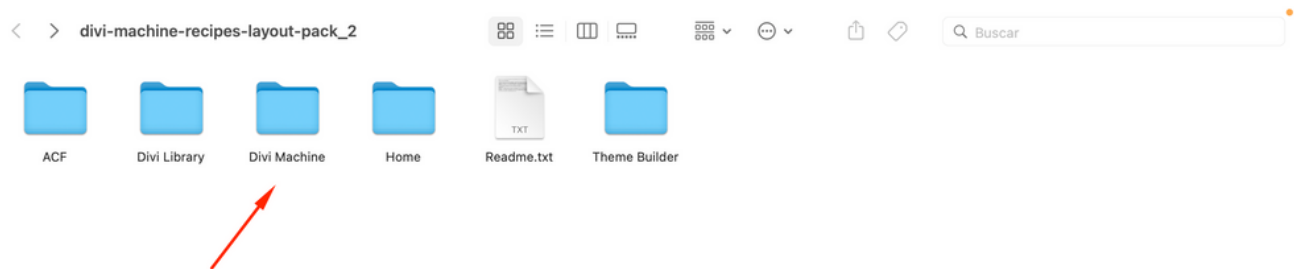
a) You'll need to create some custom post types in Divi Machine to make the layout display correctly, check the layout download page to see what custom post types you need to create. Make sure that the slugs are correct, otherwise, you might have issues.

## Step 2: Importing Divi Machine Settings

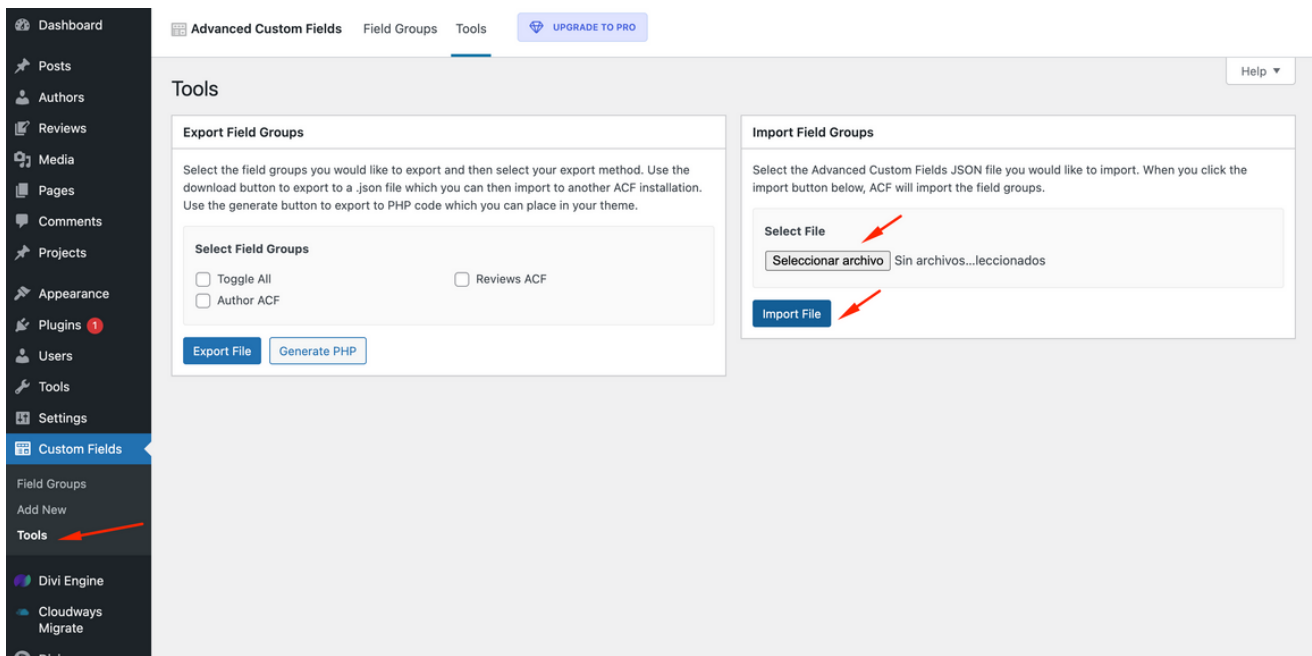
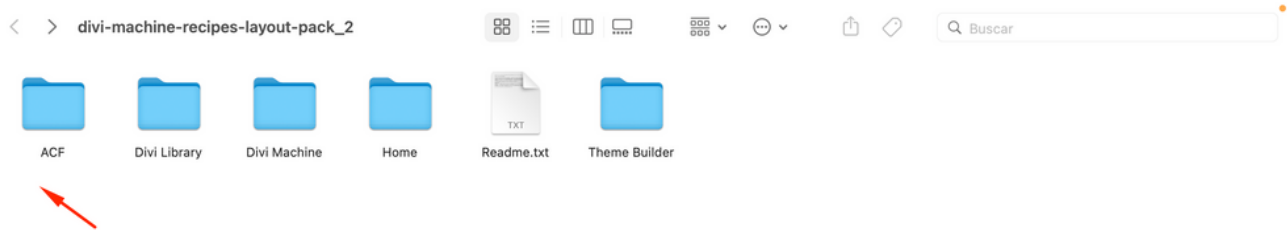
Import our settings in the zip file Divi Machine > "name of the layout".csv. Import this in the settings tab located at: Divi Engine > Machine Settings > Import/Export Settings



# 2. DIVI MACHINE

## Step 3: Importing Advanced Custom Fields

Import the ACF settings file in the folder ACF > "name of the layouts".JSON to ACF settings in Custom Fields > Tools > Import Field Groups

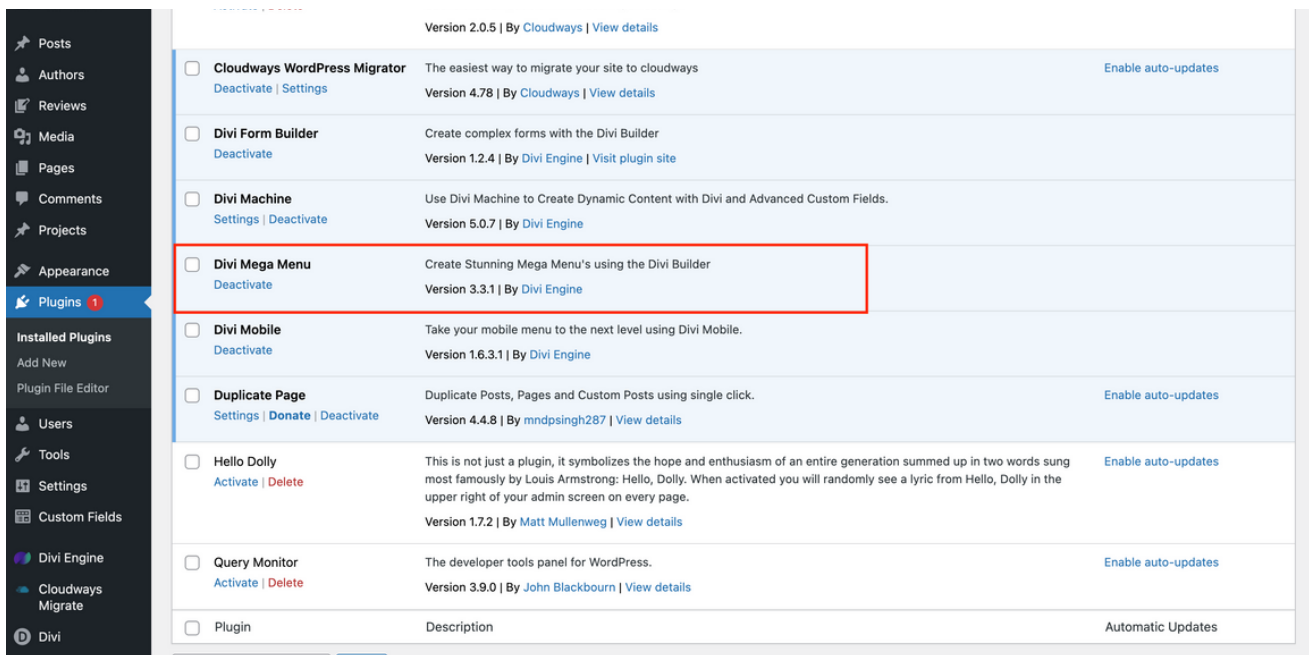




# 3. DIVI MEGA MENU

## Step 1: Install the Divi Mega Menu Plugin

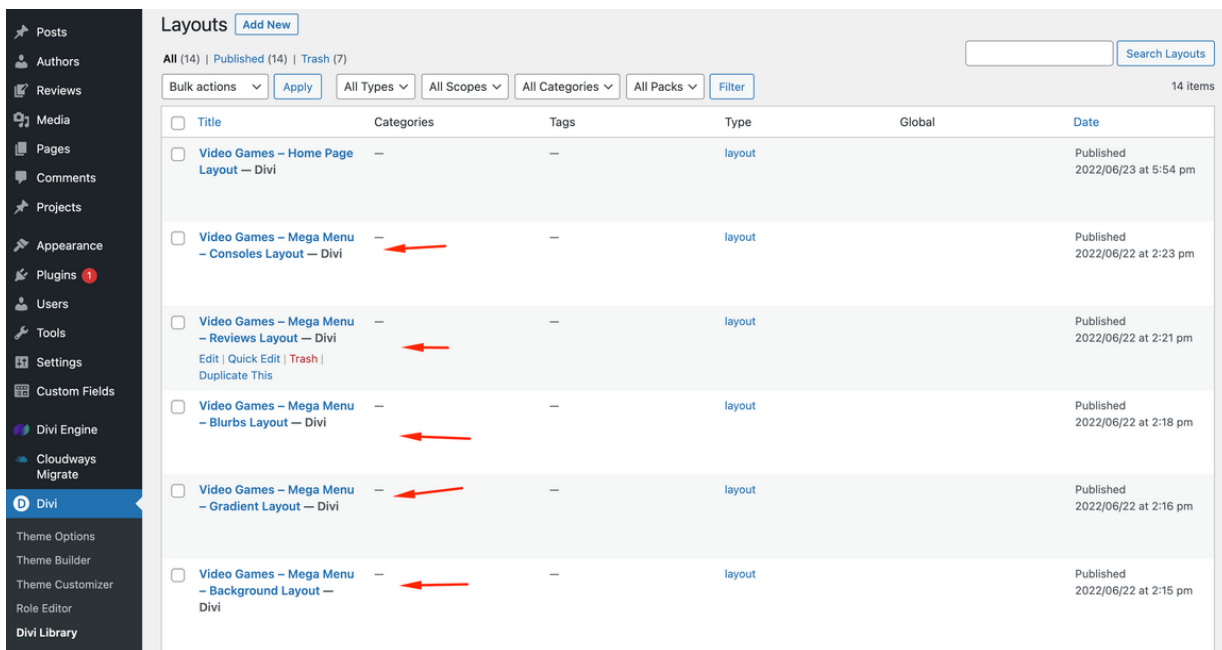
To use our Mega Menu layouts, it is necessary to have the Divi Mega Menu plugin installed, if you don't have it, you can get it [here](#).

## Step 2: Using the Divi Mega Menu Layouts

Since you imported the Divi Mega Menu layouts (see below) in step 1, from the WordPress dashboard go to Divi Engine > Mega Menu and create a new layout.

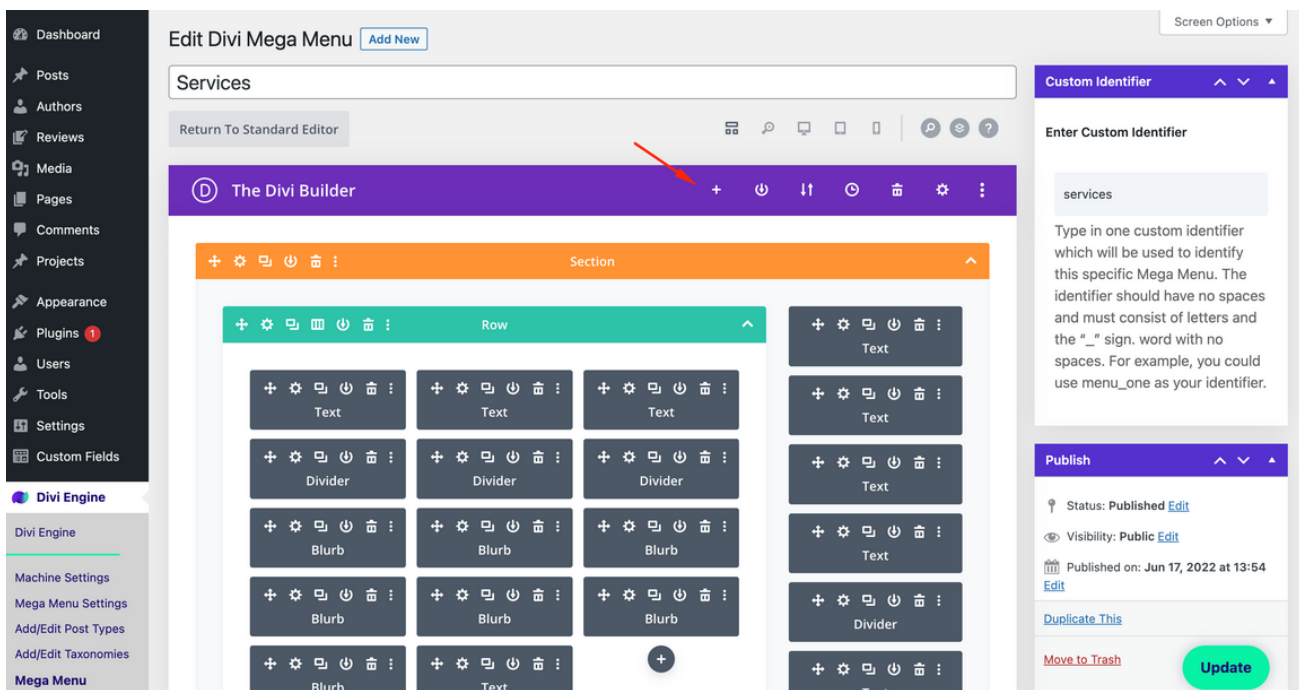

## Step 3: Importing Mega Menu Layouts

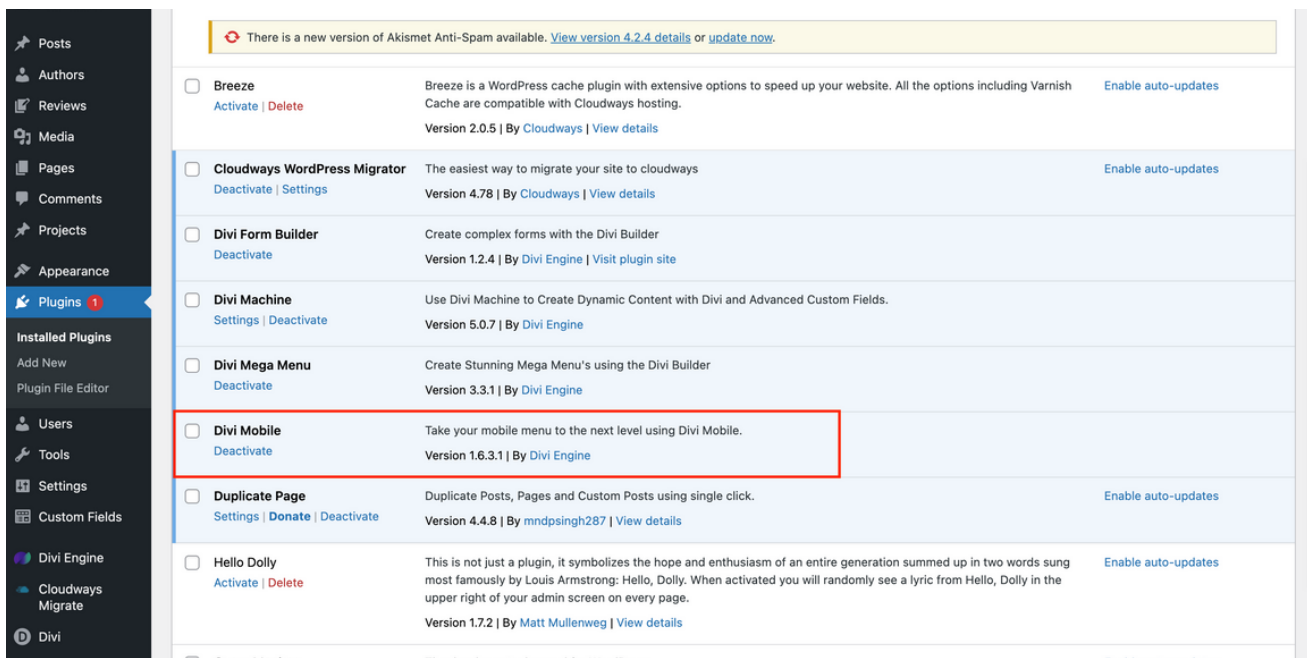
In your new Divi Mega Menu Layout, hit the plus (+) sign indicated below and import the labeled Mega Menu layout you would like to use.

## Step 1: Install the Mobile Plugin

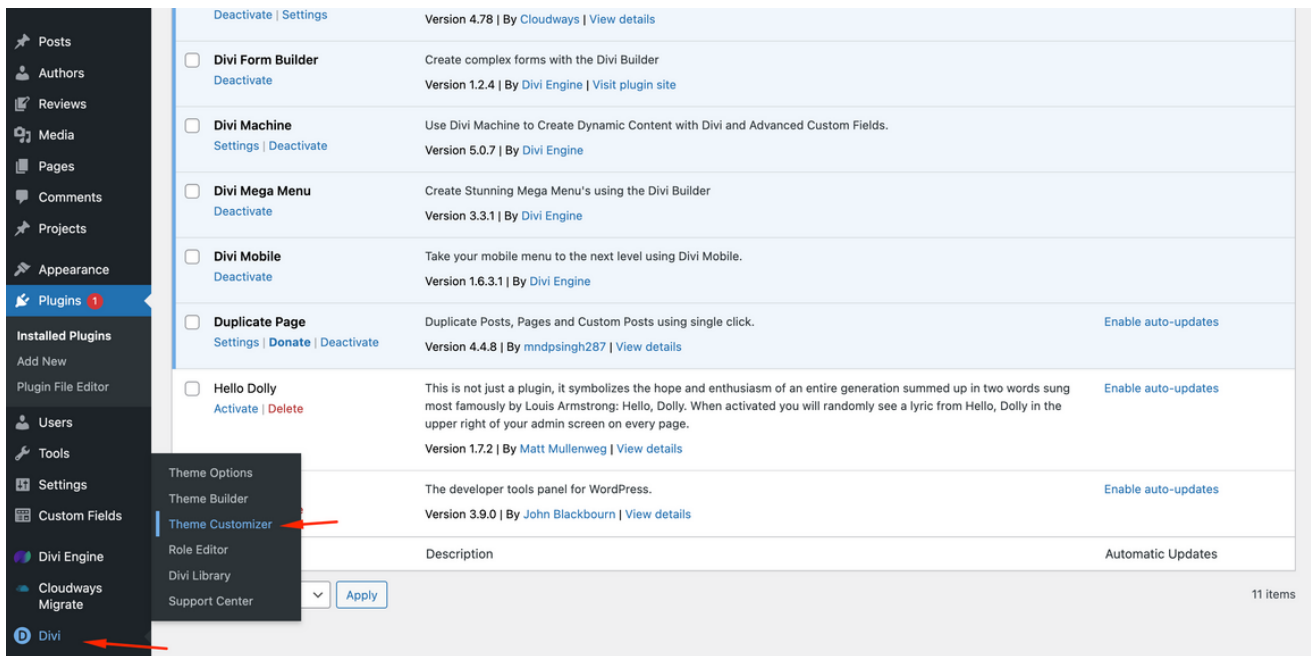
To use the Mobile Menu layout, it is necessary to have the Divi Mobile plugin installed, if you don't have it, you can get it [here](#).



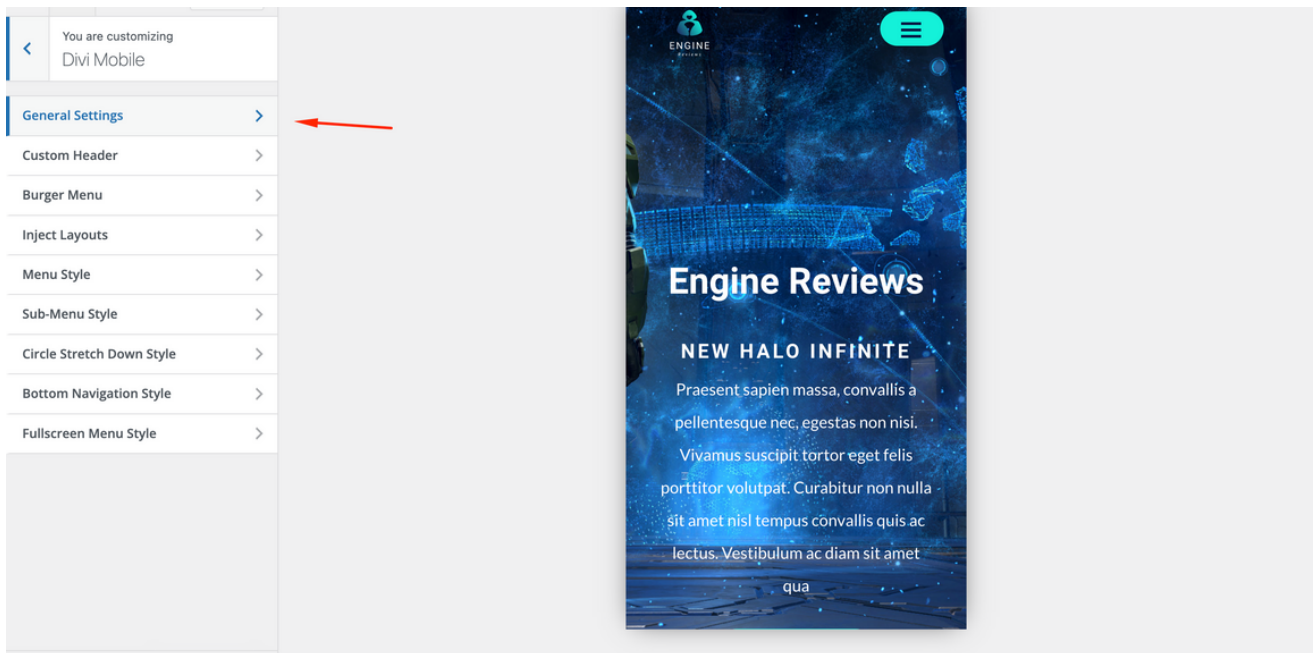
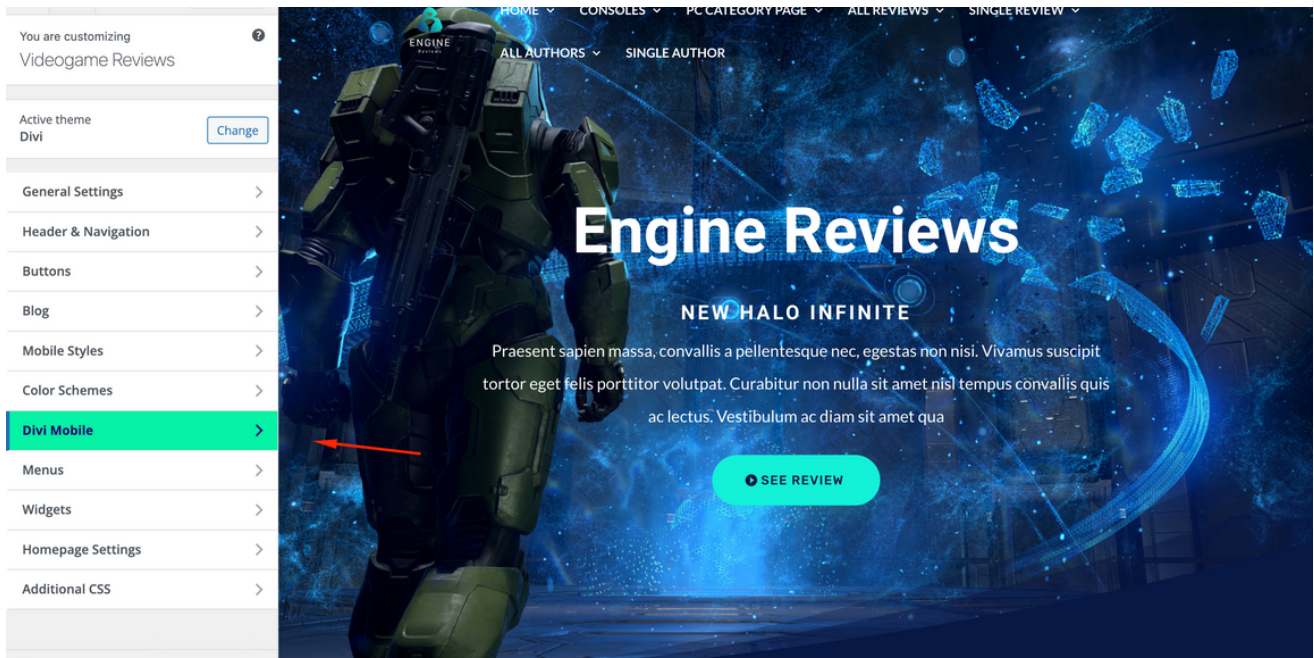

Since you imported the Divi Mobile layouts (see below) in step 1, from the WordPress dashboard go to Divi > Theme Customizer > Divi Mobile > General Settings > Here you can select one of our pre-made menu styles or you can create your own one.

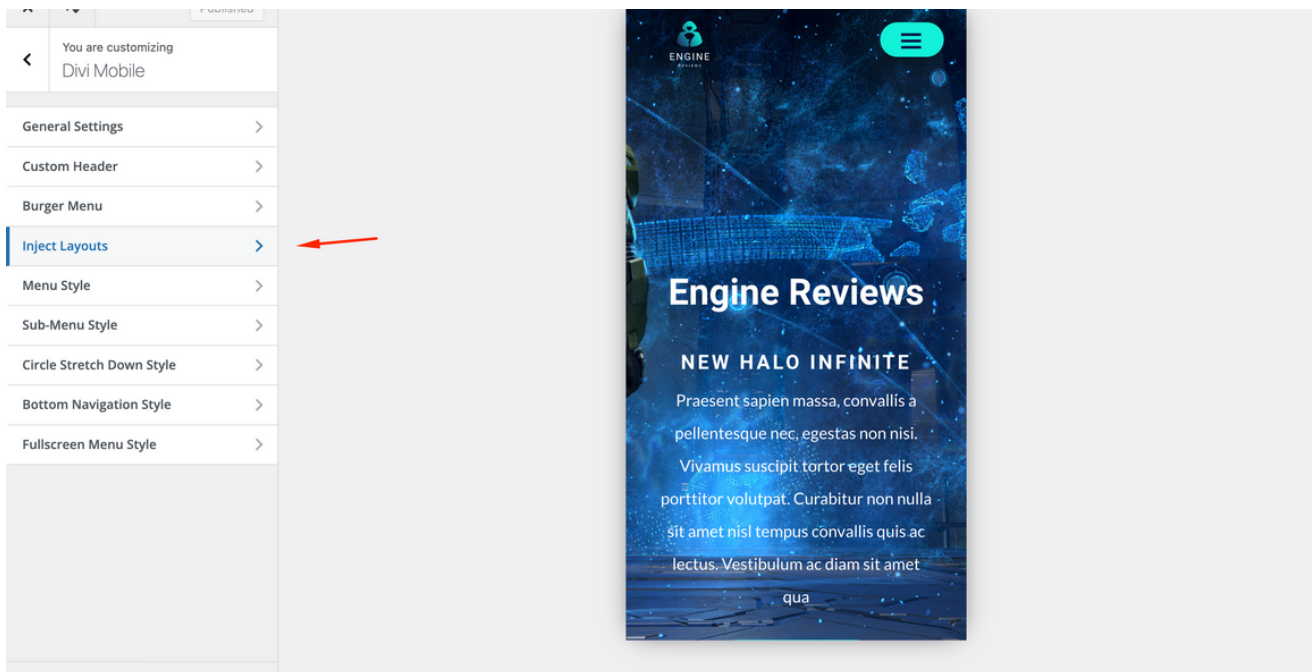

## Step 3: Injecting the layout that goes above the menu

To inject the layouts that goes above the menu, just go to Divi > Theme Customizer > Divi Mobile > Inject Layouts > Select Layout to Inject Above the Menu and choose the layout "layout with divi mobile above in the name"

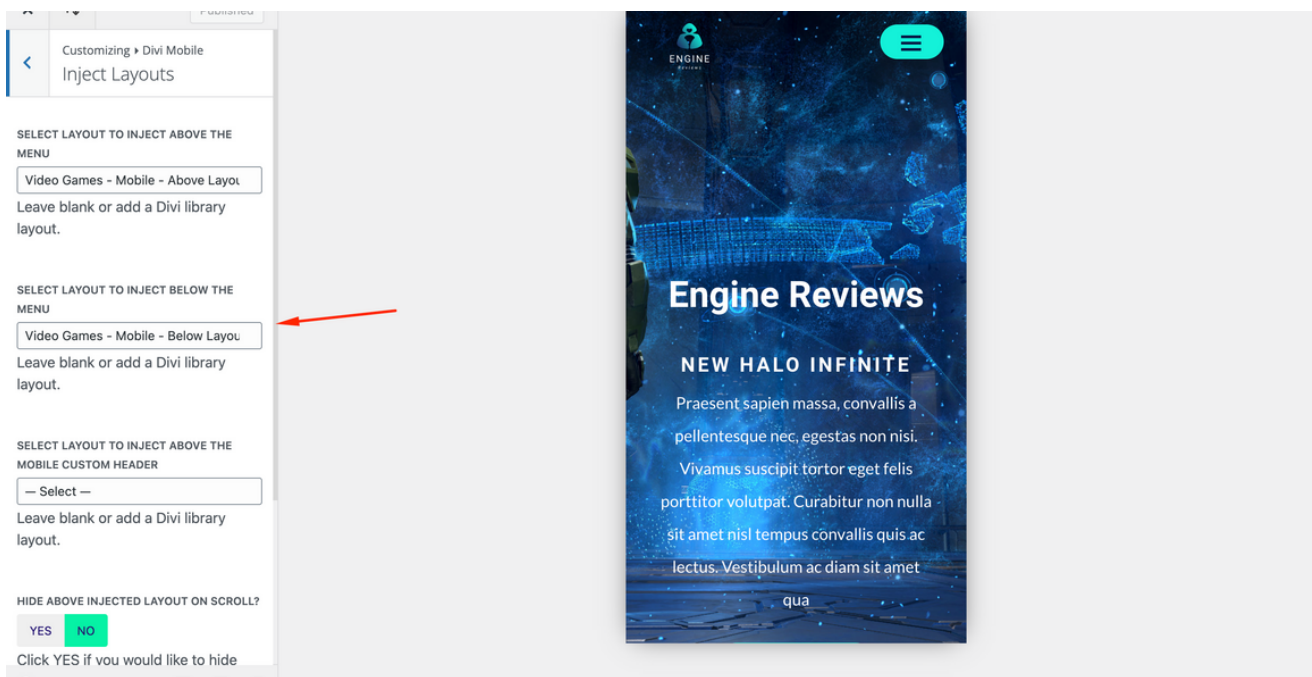

## Step 4: Injecting the layout that goes below the menu


To inject the layouts that goes below the menu, just go to Divi > Theme Customizer > Divi Mobile > Inject Layouts > Select Layout to Inject Below the Menu and choose the layout "name of the below layout"

To use our BodyCommerce layouts, it is necessary to have the Divi BodyCommerce plugin installed, if you don't have it, you can get it [here](#).



It should be perfect, but every website is different so head to test on all situations. This should be a full record on your website.


## Step 4: Creating the Registration Page

# 5. BODYCOMMERCE

**Note 1:** When you add your products the most important thing here is to:

- Make sure you add content in the editor section on each product - this could be the Divi Builder or just the default editor text.

# 5. BODYCOMMERCE

**Note 2:** If the layouts do not get assigned in the settings of BodyCommerce it might be because the ID's are not the same. If this happens, simply add them manually.

- They are all named in a way to easily identify them, so for example, "Cosmetics – Cart Page" would be the layout for the cart page.
